



Full length vadmal coat by Jean Seeker. The coat was entirely handstitched using Vogue pattern #1235. All seam allowances on the pattern were removed and the edges butted. 7/2 yarns in magenta and purple which had also received the vadmal treatment were used for all joins. The top of the sleeves and the sleeve attachment were joined using the scroll stitch. Sleeve bottoms, side seams and the collar attachment were joined using the loop stitch. The two parts of the back were joined using only magenta yarn in a buttonhole stitch, then laced with the purple yarn. All of the edges used a buttonhole stitch which was also used to attach the cuffs. For information on warp and weft see the article beginning on page 26.


